

SHAREK Recap

Since the launch of the Israeli aggression on the Gaza Strip, Sharek has been steadfast and prepared to activate its emergency response through the "Sharek Sha'bak" campaign. The primary goal is to provide immediate support and assistance to those in need, supporting their resilience in the face of indiscriminate aggression, which notably targets civilians, including children, women, individuals with disabilities, and the elderly.

After more than 102 days of the humanitarian crisis, widely acknowledged by humanitarian organizations around the world, Sharek, with the invaluable support of its local and international partners, along with its dedicated network of volunteers, has successfully implemented various humanitarian interventions. These interventions have reached 300,000 displaced individuals, facilitated by the dedication of over 150 volunteers who played a crucial role in aiding those affected during this challenging period.

The specific details of these interventions are outlined below.





- In partnership with the WFP, Sharek has distributed more than 403,890 nutritional supplements benefiting more than 13,463 displaced individuals.
- With the consistent support and generous donations of WCK, Sharek can successfully secure approximately 10,000 hot meals per day across more than six locations.



In partnership with UNFPA and the UNRWA support:

- A total of 650 group personal hygiene kits were distributed benefiting 4500 displaced individuals
- A total of 1870 Dignity Kits specially designed for women, pregnant women and girls. were distributed among shelters in the Middle, Khan Younis, and Rafah governorates.
- A total of 600 Postpartum Kits were specially designed and distributed among women who recently give birth. These kits played a pivotal role in meeting the needs of a total of 1,200 individuals, comprising 600 women who recently gave birth, along with their 600 new-borns.

Psychosodial support interventions

In Partnership with UNFPA, Project HOPE, and AMAN, Sharek took an active role in delivering comprehensive psychosocial support and relief services to survivors and those profoundly affected by the aggression. This concerted effort aims to improve living conditions and overall well-being by assisting individuals in overcoming trauma and providing guidance to navigate the challenges posed by the current circumstances. The intervention, which involved more than 404 dedicated professionals, was a vital component in the broader mission to foster resilience and recovery among the affected population. Remarkably, this initiative has benefited over 80,000 displaced individuals, a third of whom are children and adolescents.





Humanitarian initiativess

Education Support initiative for Tawjihi Students: in partnership with UNFPA, and support from UNRWA, materials and stationery have been distributed as part of our education initiative for 300 displaced Tawjihi students.

Learning Through Play Initiative: In response to the current situation in Gaza Strip where schools are repurposed as shelters, disrupting the regular educational process and adversely impacting the learning of Gazan children; Sharek implemented the Learning Through Play Initiative. It was designed to support the continuity of children's education by engaging play-based methodologies and incorporating physical activities benefiting 500 displaced children and adolescents.



Self-Care Initiative: in partnership with UNFPA, and support from UNRWA, Sharek implemented this initiative to raising awareness among displaced women regarding the importance of self-care, particularly in light of hygiene supply shortages. This initiative reached to 230 women and girls



Cooking and distributing bread for displaced people Initiative: in partnership with UNFPA, and support from UNRWA, Sharek is implementing this initiative to address food insecurity and support families in need. It involves cooking, preparing meals and bread for more than 700 displaced families in the Gaza Strip.



Distribution of Drinking Water Tanks: in partnership with UNFPA, and support from UNRWA, in response to the essential need for clean water, Sharek have initiated this initiative to distribute drinking water tanks since access to safe drinking water is a fundamental right; benefiting more than 100 displaced families.



Cinema for displaced people: in partnership with UNFPA, this initiative was implemented to serve as a comforting escape for displaced individuals, becoming a source of relief and entertainment amid difficult times. This initiative successfully reached out to over 400 displaced individuals, with more than half of them being children and adolescents.







Electrical Infrastructure Improvement Initiative: in partnership with UNFPA, and support from UNRWA, Recognizing the critical need for reliable electrical infrastructure, Sharek has implemented this initiative aiming at repairing electrical extensions and installing lighting in rooms to enhance living conditions and provide a safer and more comfortable environment for 14,000 displaced individuals.



Mobile Blood Bank initiative: In collaboration with UNFPA, and with support from UNRWA, and in cooperation with the Central Blood Bank Association - Gaza Strip (CBBS Gaza), Sharek initiated a Mobile Blood Bank program. This critical initiative was specifically designed to address the urgent need for blood during the Israeli bombing, providing essential support to civilians in Gaza who sustained injuries. The initiative witnessed the active participation of over 100 blood donors



The "Clothesline Initiative": in partnership with UNFPA and the support of the Palestinian Scout in Gaza. The primary objective was to assist displaced families in meeting their basic needs by providing essential items such as laundry pegs. This simple yet impactful initiative aimed to facilitate the drying of daily laundry and improve the ventilation of bedding for 500 displaced families, offering a practical and tangible form of support during challenging times.
